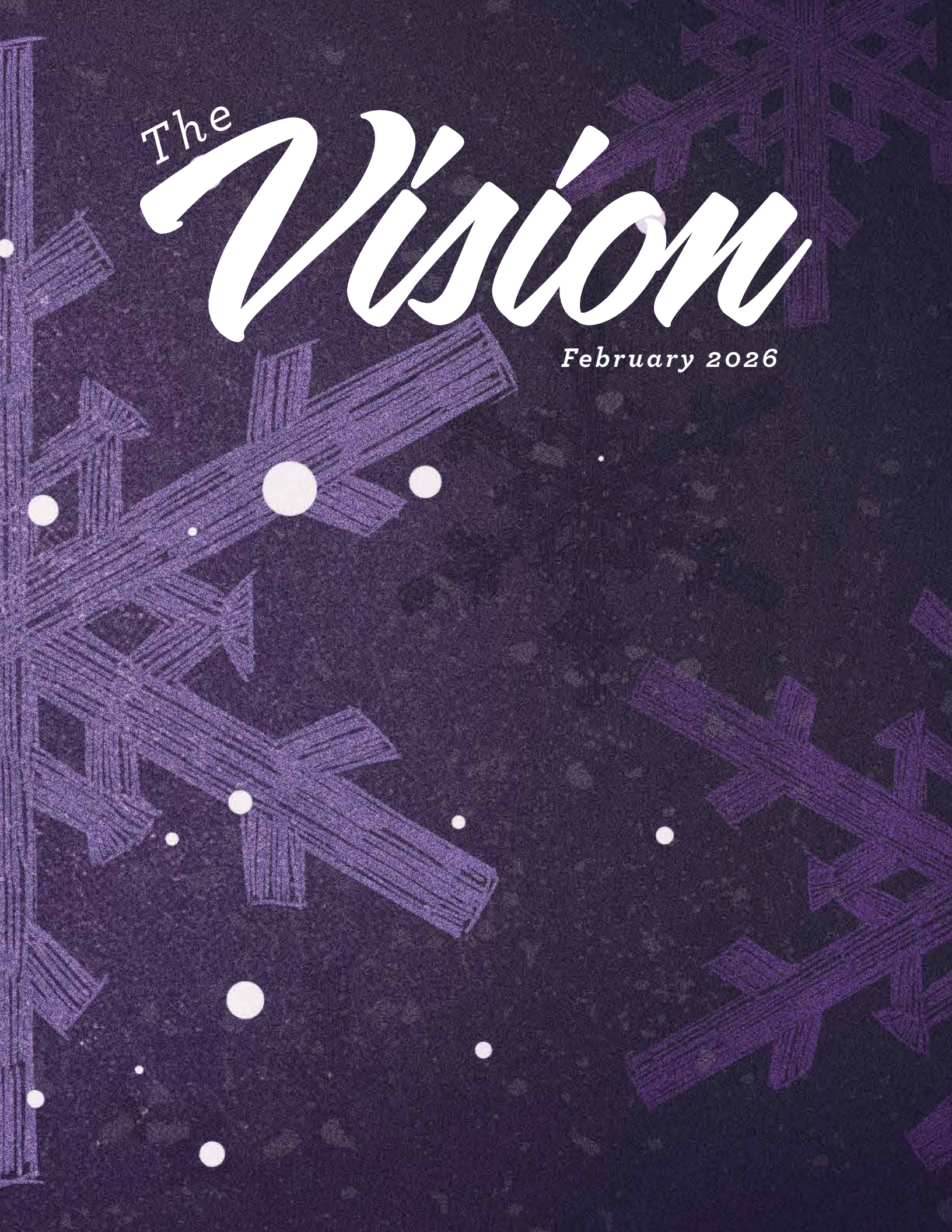

Unseen Footprints

There is a verse that has been on my heart since the very beginning of this year. It comes from Psalm 77, a psalm that captures the tension between memory and mystery.

Asaph looks back on the mighty works of God with longing, even desperation. He asks questions many of us have quietly carried: Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has His steadfast love ceased? It is the prayer of someone who knows God is faithful, yet feels the weight of His silence.

But then something shifts. Asaph remembers the Exodus, the story of God leading His people through an impossible sea. And in Psalm 77:19 we find a remarkable line: Your way was through the sea, Your path through the great waters; yet Your footprints were unseen.

God was moving with power, compassion, and perfect timing, but His people could not see a single footprint. They only discovered His guidance as they followed Him forward.

This has encouraged me deeply as we step into a new year together at Pioneer Drive. Sometimes God's work is quiet. Sometimes His guidance is hidden. Sometimes the way is made only as we walk. But unseen footprints do not mean an absent God. They mean a faithful God who leads even when our eyes cannot trace His steps.

My prayer for you this February is that you would see and experience the Lord in fresh ways, and that through the ministry of Pioneer Drive you would notice His hidden hand guiding, strengthening, and carrying you every step of the way.

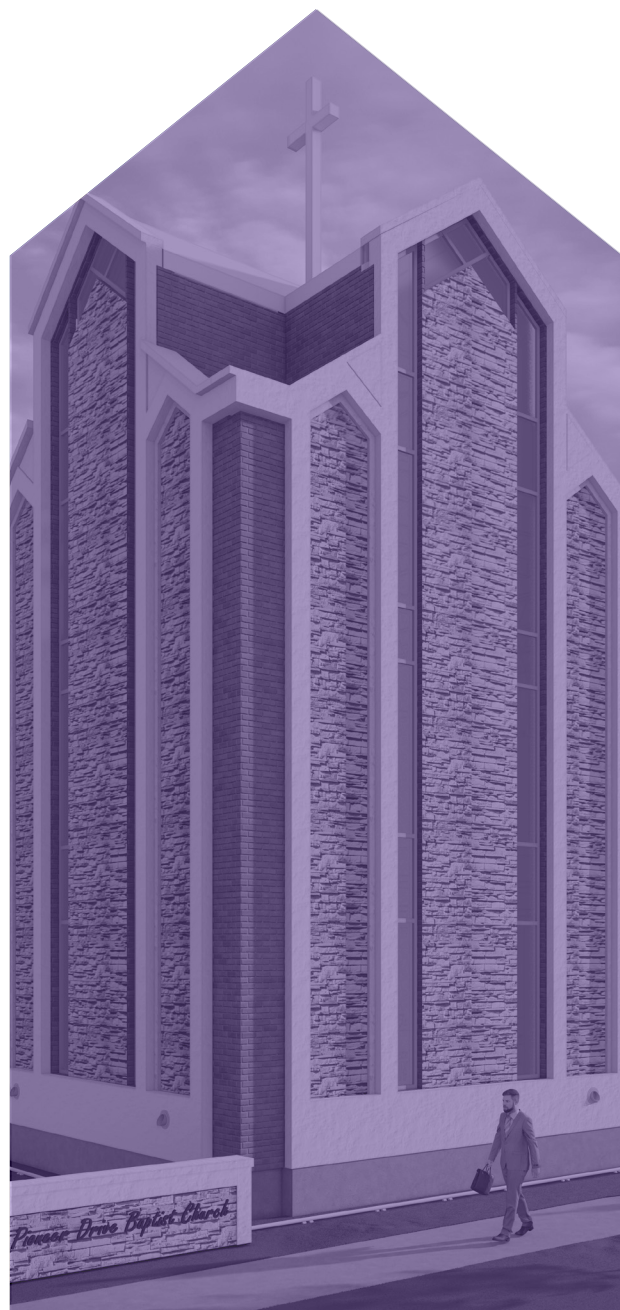


Next 70 Update

As of the end of January, we have received \$4,631,524 in contributions toward this campaign. Your generosity is making a difference!

Currently, we are finishing up 88 different holes in the ground, each thirty-three feet deep and filled with rebar and concrete. These concrete pillars extending deep into the ground act like the roots of a tree, stabilizing the foundation and protecting it from any shifting that might cause harm. Pray that our people will have deep roots, built up in Christ and the faith, just like our building's new foundation does.

Sparrow's Nest is a crisis pregnancy center located in Snyder, Texas. They are a residential pregnancy support for women in need. They help women who choose adoption with the resources they will need and support them through their pregnancy. They also help women who choose to keep their baby and help them prepare for motherhood. They offer GED support and coaching for future success.



All For One Mission is a church in the Alameda neighborhood. They are reaching the families with Worship services and Bible study. They have a food pantry and a clothes closet. Their vision also includes taking their members on mission trips to the Caribbean to share God's love outside the US.



The mission of House of Faith Abilene is to take Jesus to neighborhood children, youth, and families. They hope to provide a sense of belonging and strengthen their faith, enabling them to honor God with their lives and offer themselves in service to Him. House of Faith offers Bible clubs, youth Bible studies, and neighborhood summer activities.



Christian Women's Job Corp is a faith-based training program for women started by the Women's Missionary Union. They offer training to help women find meaningful employment to improve their lives.



Shining Star Fellowship is a beacon of light in a low-income community. They are on the corner of S. 3rd and Palm. They have weekly worship services and Bible studies. Also, they are reaching the community with other ministries.



The local chapter of Habitat for Humanity helps families in need by building new houses. Through the work of many volunteers, they are able to provide safe housing for families who need help.
